Gabrielle trained at Camberwell School of Art leaving with a First Class Honours degree in Fine Art Sculpture. She continued her studies at the Rural Development Centre in Salisbury completing several courses in Blacksmithing, and worked for two years as a welder in the metalshop of the National Theatre. Gabrielle has exhibited her drawings, paintings and sculpures in galleries across the UK and in Berlin and Paris.



Henrietta graduated with a Diploma in Ceramics from City Lit and works from her studio based in London. Her artistic practise is centred in ceramics. Modelling by hand and painting on the clay she creates a language that blends the visual and tangible to create entertaining illusions and a sense of complexity that traverses the border between 2D and 3D.

Through a fresh child-like perspective of the world, she portrays scenes of poetic tenderness and humour, interweaving metaphors for embracing life's diversity of peoples and their cultures. It is playful, representing an innocent yet thought provoking relationship with the material form.

The diversity of Reb's practice reflects her wide ranging interests and appetite for growth and exploration. Working across acrylic, pastel, charcoal and embroidery, her work ranges from large, colourful abstract paintings to more muted and intimate drawings of nudes.

Melanie Russell

74 Heybridge Avenue, Steatham Common SW16 3DT


Melanie graduated from an MFA in Fine Art from Slade School of Fine Art 2004 in London, where she now lives and works. Recent exhibitions include 'A Generous Space 3', Huddersfield Art Gallery, 'Small Works, Spring Gallery, Cheltenham and 'Contemporary British Watercolours' Maidstone Museum & Bentlif Art Gallery in Kent. Russell was invited for a residency with Marlborough College, Wiltshire in 2006. Her work was recently included in a banner project, Creative Croydon as part of London's Borough of Culture.

Melanie Russell creates drawings and paintings which capture fleeting moments of botanical beauty. The works are playful and experimental as well as quiet and sensitive, dancing between representation and abstraction. Observational drawings are the basis of her works, breaking down organic forms into complex confident lines against a patchwork of colour. She works in oil paint and watercolour and uses a variety of materials whilst drawing.

Glyn works in a small scale on landscapes and townscapes in oils and has exhibited regularly at the New English Art Club over the last few years.

Jenny is an Australian potter specialising in wheel thrown stoneware which takes its inspiration from the ancient landscapes of the outback and coastal regions of her home country. Her work features washes of warm earth-toned glazes, sometimes with bright flashes of colour, and it is functional decorative and durable.
